Greetings, this is the first monthly newsletter of the "refreshed" Peer Mentor Learning Collaborative (PMLC). For those new to our effort, the PMLC is a group of pediatric hospitals working together over the last 6 years to promote peer-to-peer mentoring in healthcare settings. The work was funded by two grants from the Lucile Packard Foundation for Children's Health (LPFCH). During the first grant, hospitals from California met and agreed upon a set of standards related to Parent Mentoring. Thereafter, we all worked to implement those standards in our respective institutions. A second grant was awarded by LPFCH expanding the Collaborative to pediatric hospitals throughout the US. This group met in the fall of 2019 – but then – well – the pandemic came upon us and our worked stopped. But now our collective attention has returned to starting or improving our Peer Mentor programs and I look forward to working with everyone again.

Prototyping the Peer Mentor e-Learning Platform

This month's article is <u>The Role of Lay Health Workers in Pediatric Chronic Disease: A Systematic Review</u>, 2013. Raphael, J.L., Rueda, A., Lion, K., & Giordano, T.P. Academic Pediatrics, 13:5. This is a review of articles addressing the effectiveness of parent mentors and related roles. A total of 17 articles met criteria for evaluating the impact of parent mentoring. The authors found "modest improvements in urgent care use, symptoms, and parental psychosocial outcomes."
